Club Members in the News

On a recent trip to Granada, Nicaragua, club members Bill Marquardt and Judy Heiderscheidt experienced some real bad luck. The following is an article that appeared in the Nicaraguan English language newspaper, The Tica Times, detailing what they endured:

Carjacking Raises New Security Concerns

GRANADA – A recent gunpoint carjacking of three U.S. citizens on a darkened road in Tipitapa, 15 kilometers from Managua's International Airport, has raised concerns that a group of bandits is following tourists from the airport to rob them as they arrive in the country with their luggage, passports and money.

U.S. citizen and Granada resident Donna Tabor, and friends Bill Marquardt and Judy Heiderscheidt, of Fort Collins, Colorado, were robbed last Wednesday night around 9:00 p.m. on a poorly lit section of the old Tipitapa highway that is often used as a shortcut from the airport to Granada.

They were ambushed by another vehicle and forced out of Tabor's pickup truck by three armed men, who then stole the truck, seven
5 bags of luggage, two passports, credit cards and close to \$1,900 in

cash, before leaving the three victims standing in a ditch along the side of the dark road.

TABOR remembers the bandits' car almost sideswiped them on the dark, pothole filled road, before skidding around to a 180-degree stop to block the road in front of them. Tabor guesses that they might have been followed from the airport, or the nearby intersection.

The bandits then got out of their car with pistols and a shotgun, and forced the three U.S. citizens out of the truck and into a ditch by the side of the road, where they were left.

Marquardt says the men, who he guesses were in their 30s, appeared "very professional" and calm during the robbery.

"If they had been panicky, we would probably be dead," added wife Heiderscheidt, an academic advisor at Colorado State University.

A good-hearted and impoverished Nicaraguan family living in a farmhouse nearby the scene of the crime heard the three victims' shouts for help, and came to their rescue. The Nicaraguan family called the police, offered lodging to the three stranded gringos, and even scraped together a "couple of crumbled up old bills" to help out, Marquardt told The Nica Times, adding that they didn't accept the family's money.

Luckily, all three victims own property in Granada, and had other resources in the country available to them. Tabor's pickup truck was later found abandoned in a nearby cornfield and returned to her, but the passports, money and luggage – including several bags

of Donated materials for Nicaraguans – never turned up.

WHEN the robbery victims went to the U.S. Embassy the following day to report the crime, they were told that a similar incident had occurred not long before to another U.S. tourist who left the airport in a taxi and was robbed near the same spot.

DAILY U.S.-origin flights on American Airlines and Continental – accounting for most of the U.S. tourists in the country – arrive in Nicaragua after dark.

Marquardt and Heiderscheidt, who have been visiting Nicaragua regularly since 1998, said they usually spend the first night here at the Best Western hotel across the street from the airport, to avoid traveling the country at night.

They blame the carjacking incident entirely on themselves, for going against their own better judgment.

"We have a rule about not traveling at night and we broke our own rule," Heiderscheidt said.

"We take total responsibility for this," Marquardt added. "It was very stupid."

TABOR, who is critical of how the police handled the situation ("everyone had their hand out"), said the incident gave her a wakeup call after having lived here for nine years.

DESPITE their rude welcome back to Nicaragua, neither Heiderscheidt nor Marquardt claim to be in bad spirits, saying that they are just happy to be alive. And they say the incident hasn't

soured them on Nicaragua.

"If you do something stupid anywhere in the world, you get in trouble," Marquardt said.

The Colorado couple, who hopes to one day open a private library in their home in Granada, says they will continue to travel frequently to Nicaragua and plan on spending more time here in the future.

And they plan to return to visit the family that helped them out in Tipitapa to thank them properly and bring them a gift from the United States.

All three victims marveled at the compassion and kindness shown by the family that took them in. In one short period of 15 minutes, the three U.S. citizens witnessed both the best and worst Nicaragua has to offer.
