We drove north out of town until we hit the Cherokee Park Road. It was a beautiful sunny day but the dirt road was dry and we kicked up clouds of dust. When we got to Upper Cherokee, the road was getting wetter and the wind started to blow. After a brief stop at a potty box, we started to look for Coyote John and Ryan because they had spent the night camping in Upper Cherokee. Even though some of us never put our hubs in, this was a great trip. Most of the people on the trip had never been all the way over Sand Creek Pass. Alabama Jamie had taken over three hundred pictures on the trip. Guess their not used to the mountains and the snow that most of us take for granted. Just another enjoyable day of scenery.


