A three of four-wheelers went out on a beautiful Saturday Morning in search of the perfect snow drift to bust. Just for the fun of it, let's say they were a couple of Mountaineer trip planners and a friend scouting out a trip for the club. Not too far into the mountains, a couple of hunters flagged them down and said that they had an emergency and asked if they could help. Upon reaching the camp, they found a hunter down and non responsive. None of the six hunters had CPR training and twenty minutes had already passed since he went down and he had already turned blue. They found out that one of the hunting party went to higher ground to see if his cell phone would work. They also were told that the fellow had a history of heart problems.

Two of the group sprung into action and started to administer CPR while the third went down the mountain for help. They could not find a pulse and it looked like a hopeless case but they tried to save his life anyway. They spent almost a half an hour working on him but still could not find a pulse. The Sheriff and Lenora got there about an hour later as well as an ambulance with an EMT on board. They found that the man had expired immediately after he had gone down and there was nothing the two trip planners could have done to bring him back to life. The sheriff later said that an autopsy revealed that the man's heart had literally exploded and he was dead before he hit the ground.

Two characters in this story are real Mountaineers and the third was one of the Mountaineers brother-in-law. We should be thankful that they are on almost every club trip. All three have taken the time to be trained in first aid and CPR. I personally would like to commend them on behalf of the Mountaineers for jumping in to try and save the life of a stranger on the trail. Thank you Brett, Troy and Brett's brother-in-law, you guys are awesome!!!
