Once we got everyone headed the way they wanted to go, it didn't take to long to get everybody back to their respective trail-heads.

The only problem we had the rest of the way home was that it got warm enough to melt the snow on the county road and turn it into a muddy mess. I'm sure that the car washes in town liked all the quarters we spent cleaning our rigs but probably didn't appreciate the mud we left behind. All in all, it was a challenging day for most but still a fun day for the Mountaineer family.


