
4th Annual Valve Cover Races

The basic rules are as follows:

- 15" maximum width 30" maximum length 10" maximum height 10 lb. maximum weight
- Weight will be by official scales only
- No engines No propulsion of any kind
- One valve cover per chassis No switching chassis or cover
- Automotive valve covers only with stock gasket surface
- Nothing can be mounted in front of either the valve cover or chassis
- No moving or movable weight

The race will be for distance, exactly as in past years. Good luck!!!

Sister: Oh, we just got off of highway 119.


Snake solves problem


