The bottom part of the trail didn't have too much snow. The only problem encountered was the creek crossings. The few that didn't have lockers would drop a wheel into the hole in the ice and didn't have

enough momentum to jump the ice lip coming out. As we gained altitude, the snow got a little deeper and a few got sucked into the giggly weeds. That didn't hold us up to much as a snatching strap made

quick work of it. By the time we got to the meadow, it was lunch time. After a quick lunch, a few tried their luck on the Stump Hill Challenge. Even though Mike G. broke the trail



to Stump Hill, the going was tough for the ones without power and tires. Only 4 or 5 vehicles were able to complete the trip up the hill. Most that tried only made it to the gate when they lost traction and came sliding back down the hill. It was tough for the group to make it back to the meadow due to the



frozen ice at the creek crossing. It didn't help to have another group of 4 wheelers that didn't seem to be equipped for the challenge, trying to make Their way to the hill.

While the Stump Hill group was getting everything sorted out, several vehicles in the meadow decided to go up to the Swamp Creek area to play in the fresh snow. We were being led by Darwin who was breaking the trail, being closely followed by his two brothers, Roger and Rich. About half way up, Rich reported that he was stuck and needed a tug. As there was no traction, they had to use the winch. They finally discovered that the front end was not doing its share of the work (Later they discovered that the u-joint straps had come loose). It took quite a while to get Rich up the hill. By this time, there were a lot of vehicles stacked up like cordwood all along the icy up hill climb. It was the typical Mountaineers snow bashing trip, hurry up and wait! Once the Stengaard clan got moving, several of the waiting vehicles could not move as they were sitting on a sheet of ice, more strapping and winching.

We don't think that there were to many on this trip that didn't get at least one good "stuck" in on the day. It was just another glorious day of snow bashing with the Mountaineer family.







