Some trails are named to scare you but then later you find out that the trail is just a walk in the park. Others are named to trick you into thinking something mellow is ahead when you really should think twice. Carnage Canyon is an oldie but goodie just outside Boulder, Colorado. It is a trail that has earned its name. The trail is only about 1.2 miles in length and runs along the floor of a canyon, which is tight and filled with large rocks.

The trail is not one of the most difficult on the planet but offers some good hard core challenges. Good flex, high clearance, rocker protection and skid plates are a must for this trip. 


