Just before we got to Lyons, the Jeep started to loose power and smoking. Upon inspection, we could see that the brakes were hanging up and Todd suspected that the proportioning valve was the culprit. He was also leaking some vital fluids. He told us to go on and he would turn around and limp it home.

At the trail head we aired down, locked in our hubs and started up the rocky Middle St. Vrain Road. This three and a half miles of road has a few rock gardens and mud holes. Our newest club member, Dick Marolf, had brought his stock Dodge Durango on the trip instead of his CJ-7. He had to get a tug a few times to get through. When asked if he had done any damage to the truck, Dick replied, "Ah shucks (that's how they talk in Nebraska) I've done more damage in a parking lot".

At the end of the Middle St. Vrain Road we turned onto the Coney Flats Road and started our climb towards the top and the Coney Creek crossing.



We had to give Dick a tug once on this section also. We arrived at the water crossing about 12:30, circled the wagons and settled in for lunch. The group was sitting around gabbing and enjoying a very peaceful setting when all of a sudden the tranquillity was broken by Ross and the "Rockin' Ghost". He had gotten a late start and couldn't catch up until we had stopped for lunch. After lunch, we did the water crossing. Several took this as a Kodak moment and posed for pictures in the deep water.

The trip back down to Beaver Reservoir was uneventful. It was just another perfect day to wheel with the Mountaineer family.


WTC Ground Zero

Mountaineer Kim Schleppy was asked by the American Red Cross to come to New York City and work for three weeks as she and Bob have gone through the disaster training course. Kim flew to New York City on September 27th and was immediately put into what is called Respite 1 which is about a block away from ground zero. After a couple of days there, she was asked to become the Supervisor of Kitchen & Eating Facilities at the newly opened Respite 3, only 50 feet from WTC ground zero. She is working the busiest shift each day feeding the response and recovery people. facility is open 24 hours a day and does have sleeping quarters for the workers. She reports that the stench is almost unbearable at times and they do wear masks a lot of the time. Kim will return home on the 18th.

This is not the first time that Kim has been working for the Red Cross during a disaster. Earlier this year she was out in eastern Colorado for the tornado relief. The Mountaineers wish to thank Kim and Bob for their personal sacrifice during this time of national tragedy.




October Trip
