- , the District will host its first NPLD open to both the public and our partners. The day will provide a unique collaboration opportunity at our Redfeather Lakes Work Center. The event includes a chance to join us in the celebration in two different ways*:

- Be our guest and showcase your organization by hosting a recruitment and activity booth in an area that will be open to the public. Finish the day at an outdoor partner recognition dinnerand don't forget to bring a chair. *We are inviting the public to visit your booth between 12 and 4 pm. The hands-on sessions will run from 9 am to 3:30 pm.

This meaningful day of outdoor stewardship and hands-on learning in the woods at our Redfeather Ranger Station includes five roundrobin mini-sessions comprised of two service and three educational projects. Each session will last 50 minutes,

And run from 9- 3:30. The keystone session includes the District's first ever pine beetle tree revegetation planting in nearby Dowdy Lake Campground. Other mini-sessions will include: • Map-and-compass navigation (or what to do when your GPS battery fails) • Leave-No-Trace skills course • Wildlife track and scat ID • Social trail restoration work Instructors include LNT master trainers, City of Fort Collins Master Naturalists, and Forest Service silvaculturists, recreation planners, and wildland fire fighters. You might find some of these skills handy no matter what natural resource agency you support with your volunteer time, and on a more personal level, too.

After the sessions, we'll feed you a catered BBQ dinner as a thank you for participating! (Note: You must tell us if you will be staying for dinner by completing the "food preference" section at the registration site). The first 200 participants will receive one FREE federal parks entrance/day use fee pass coupon, valid for one year from NPLD 2010. It is good for you and anyone accompanying you in your vehicle. 
